Things have been coming alive and blooming in the yard and things have been coming alive in the CODR ministry as well.

April and May have been great months for us. We received a lot of awesome feedback and support from the March Newsletter mailing so we've decided that in addition to the quarterly postal mailing, we'll publish an electronic newsletter each month to send out via email. This is the biggest need the men in Reentry have and has the potential to be a wonderful way to minister to not only the Reentry candidates but also our community. As you can imagine this is a huge undertaking and one that we don't want to rush into. This is an exciting time for CODR ministry because we have a great foundation established and some awesome ways for people to get involved right away, but we also have a lot of space for creativity and new ideas.

We know God is putting His ministry team together by calling people from many different locations and backgrounds. If you feel that God is nudging you in this direction, we would love to get to know you and help you find where God want's you to serve.

Join us for Worship!

Worshipping with the men inside of the prison walls is an amazing experience! The guys love knowing that they are valued and not forgotten. We need worship volunteers at both Fort Dodge and Rockwell City prisons. Minsters and musicians are especially welcome! Volunteering inside of the prison requires filling out an Iowa DOC volunteer application form which includes a background check, then completing some short video training courses.

<u>Connie's Closet (meeting basic needs at the Fort Dodge men's halfway house)</u> Men entering the Fort Dodge Community Corrections Center (men's halfway house) after release have next to nothing, so we supply their closet with basic needs such as: Clothing, Shoes, Coats, washcloths, towels, and Hygiene supplies. This level of support requires no special training and is coordinated by a CODR volunteer lead (Connie).

 Currently we are in need of Towels, Washcloths, and men's shorts and sweatpants (XL-3X), Shirts (XL-5X), Belts (all sizes), Shoes (tennis shoes, black dress, non-slip and work boots, socks (6-12 size), Underwear (L-3X), Plastic hangers. Donations can be dropped off at St. Olaf or Grace Lutheran Church in Fort Dodge Ia.

<u>Transportation Assistance - RCF</u>

Men entering the RCF after release often times do not have access to transportation, so volunteers provide rides to appointments, job interviews, home visits etc. This level of support happens in partnership with AFES (Athletics for Education and Success – Fort Dodge) and does require some training and a DOC background check.



Reentry Teams - RCF and beyond

Men transitioning back into to society face many barriers and can have many needs. Reentry Mentors develop a relationship with their mentee and provide support across a broad spectrum. Reentry candidates are selected through a vigorous application process in concert with DOC staff to ensure that they are good candidates for CODR Reentry Support. This is a much more involved level of support and requires training by the DOC and CODR Reentry Coordinator. Reentry Volunteers are also encouraged to participate in weekly worship services at one of the prison facilities.

Remembering Pastor Carroll Lang February 18, 1943 - February 20, 2023




During the spring of 1997 as the new Fort Dodge prison was being established, Pastor Carroll D. Lang was called as the Mission Developer Pastor of The Church of the Damascus Road. This new congregation would include the Fort Dodge and Rockwell City Prisons. Pastor Lang officially began his ministry on August 1, 1997 at the facility in Rockwell City.

On Thursday, August 28 the first worship service was held with 24 inmates a 12 guests attending. Later bible studies began on Tuesdays. In April of 1998 the Fort Dodge facility began receiving inmates from the Classification Center in Oakdale, near lowa City. 19 inmates were brought in the first week and of those 12 attended the very first Fort Dodge prison service. The ministry grew quickly and soon well over 100 men were attending services and bible studies between the two facilities. Right away the need for reentry support was recognized so Pastor Lang partnered with DOC staff to form what was to become the CODR Reentry process. Inmates would apply to be accepted as Reentry Candidates and teams of volunteers were identified and trained to provide support for men transitioning out of incarceration. In 2009 Pastor Lang retired as CODR Lead Pastor but stayed very involved overseeing the Reentry process.

Carroll's tireless work both inside and outside the prison walls transformed the lives of many men and their families. He has left a legacy of healing and restoration that we are proud to inherit. The partnerships he created and nurtured in this ministry has enabled The Church of the Damascus Road to thrive even through the pandemic. His life was an inspiration to us all.

Our thoughts and prayers remain with his family, especially his beloved wife Judy.
