August 28th we had the honor and privilege of baptizing 34 individuals into the family of God at the Fort Dodge Correctional Facility. This was the first time baptism has been offered there in over 4 years and the response was amazing! We had well over 100 in attendance, including 4 of our own volunteers and several Department of Corrections staff. Thank you so much to everyone who helped make it happen! Men are sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ out on the yard, lives are changing and a culture of darkness is shifting, one man at a time, into a community of light. God is amazing!



Please keep these new believers in your prayers, that they continue to grow their faith and stay connected to the church. Please also pray for the DOC staff, for their physical and spiritual health as they work on God's behalf to provide security and safety for these men. By God's grace CODR has been given permission to lead worship services at FDCF once a month and provide support for the inmate Deacon team. We pray that our presence inside the facility can continue to grow and that we can demonstrate the transformative power of Christ's love.



This change in hearts not only effects the lives of the incarcerated individuals, but their families as well. We've already heard from some men who've been able to repair relationships through their new found love of Christ. Others have shared that this has been the catalyst for family members to start going to church. Listening and Doing 19My dear brothers, take note of this: Eve one should be quick to listen, slow to sp

Starting at the end of August, the congregation at NCCF in Rockwell City started a brand new sermon series on the book of James. If you know anything about James, you know he doesn't mince words and is not afraid to challenge his readers into action. He loves God's church and wants to see it thrive in spite of it's hostile environment (a pretty relevant theme for us all!). It has been an amazing series so far and I'm sure it will continue to challenge us as we grow in our ability to live out our faith in tangible ways.

James 1:1-18 taught us that God's people will have to endure persecution and trials, but that this is an opportunity to grow our faith as we learn to depend more and more on Jesus. God loves us and will give us wisdom if we have faith in Him alone. Everything good comes from Him.

INSIGHT from INSIDE Dear J: A Letter to My Younger Self

I know you don't care, but I need a minute of your time. I know some qualities about you that you might not know. Time's not on your side right now. the path you're choosing brings a lot of loneliness - feelings of inadequacy, resentment, despair, and hopelessness. You can't see it yet because it all seems so rewarding. It's a trick and you can't fall for it.

You don't know it yet, but your childhood was traumatic and unwarranted. It's causing you to be mad at the world. It's causing you to be bitter and evil. It's making you someone you're not. You can overcome that pain, hurt, and anger though. You have feelings of abandonment and they're forcing you to search for love and acceptance in a place where it doesn't exist. The streets don't love you - they don't love anyone! There's plenty of evidence to prove it.

You're stronger than you know though. You're a leader - it's in your blood. Those men that you idolize don't mean you well. No one with your best interest in mind would lead you down a path that breeds failure. There's

never been a successful criminal and the chances of you being the first are zero, but you know that. You can't live a double life. Your criminal world will collide with your real world and it will all come crumbling down. The people you love the most will look at you different. It won't matter that your heart's in the right place and that you have the best intentions. Actions and results are the only traits that we'll be judged on in this world. I'll keep this short because I know you don't care. Just ask yourself this - will you care at thirty and you've been locked up for eleven years with an eternity to go? Will you care at forty-five and you realize you've been locked of for twenty-five years with no end in sight? Will you care that you never had a chance to be an adult? Will you care that you never had children? Will you care that the women in your life will never really love you the way

they would if you were free? Will you care if your parents die while you're locked up? I need you to ask yourself what's really important to you? I need you to remember all of your hopes and dreams and never lose sight of them. You can accomplish them all, trust me. I know you. I'll fill you in on a secret. You're going to become an amazing man - an amazing person. The question is, do you want to be locked up and have a minimal impact on the world or do you want so be free where your impact on the world is limitless? Incarcerated Individual - FDCF
